
Tour of Switzerland

A book in Progress

Our many encounters with people from all churches and the focus on the resurrection of Christ have broadened my understanding of the Church. I am in the process of completing a book on the "mystery of the church", from a perspective that is both rooted in my Protestant tradition and open to ecumenical reflection.

I am deepening what theology calls the "notes of the Church: one, holy, catholic (or universal), apostolic". I pursue a biblical, theological and spiritual approach. This mystery is the Risen One among us who gives life to his Church. Was it not in order to gather us together that he was "lifted up from the earth" (John 12:32)?

Frankfurt

After Munich and Augsburg last year, we went back to Germany, planned to Frankfurt and Düsseldorf. In fact, a few days before our departure, we learned that the canton of Vaud had been put on the "red list" by the German Health Authorities. The meetings therefore took place by means of a video conference.



We met some leaders of the Community of Churches in Germany (ACK) who participated in the Jubilee of the Reformation in 2017. In view of the Jubilee of the Resurrection in 2033 we were very interested to learn about this experience. It was not a confessional and confrontational commemoration of the Reformation, but an "ecumenical culture of remembrance", which opened up new perspectives for church cooperation. We also met the leaders of the two largest federations of Evangelical and Pentecostal churches.



Anafora - Egypt

A team from JC2033 went to Egypt at the beginning of December to meet several church leaders, including the Coptic Orthodox Patriarch, Pope Tawadros. The latter supports the project of a Conference that will bring together the Church of this great country, in all its diversity.

It will take place in the magnificent monastery of Anafora, in the desert between Cairo and Alexandria. It will be partly transmitted by video-conference.
